# Stedfast News Chaplain's Page

#### Dear Friends,

It started in September! That was the time when our local Garden Centre began the annual process of transforming itself from a supplier of plants, gardening tools and garden furniture into a Christmas Emporium. At the time of writing, you would be hard pressed to find anything unrelated to Christmas in the Centre! The once big open space that was a home to plants, seeds and everything to do with gardens has now been colonised by Christmas decorations and gifts of every shape and size. There are enough artificial Christmas Trees to create a forest and, if all the Christmas lights get purchased and plugged in, the Rampion wind farm will be working overtime! Whilst I really enjoy Christmas, I must admit that I find starting to see Christmas in September depressing and now, in November, I find their huge display almost overwhelming. I feel for parents who will have had to be telling their small children for some time that Father Christmas isn't coming just yet!

No doubt you will have heard some of the major retailers encouraging us to have a real splurge at Christmas this year, because last year we couldn't. I suspect that although some of these retailers have been encouraging us to 'shop early' because there will be genuine shortages, others may have jumped on this bandwagon to get us spending. I had to smile at the sign outside a coffee shop near one of my churches declaring recently 'Scone shortages! Buy your scones here while you can!' The owner did have the grace to add 'Please' at the bottom of the sign! On the other hand, I hear on the news this morning that there will not, after all, be a shortage of turkeys this Christmas, which may or may not be good news for the turkeys!

One of the leading retailers was quoted as saying that the High Street needs to have a 'successful' Christmas this year, and that set me musing: what makes Christmas 'successful'? Can the success of Christmas really be measured by the boost it gives to the economy? Will your Christmas only be successful if your decorations, tree, lights and your Christmas dinner table approximates to the pictures of these things in glossy magazines? I do enjoy all the trimmings of Christmas, but at the same time I don't subscribe to the idea that unless your Christmas looks like something out of a magazine it is decidedly unsuccessful.

So how do we rate whether or not Christmas is a success? We would surely want to say that, fundamentally, the success of 'Christmas 2021' has to lie in its relationship to the very first Christmas of all. Putting it rather crudely, wasn't the 'success' of the first Christmas achieved when Mary said to the angel, 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be to me according to your word'? Wasn't success achieved when Joseph received the message, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit' and he did so? And wasn't the ultimate success achieved when Mary 'gave birth to her first-born son, and wrapped him in swaddling bands and laid him in a manger because there was no place for them in the inn'? As St. John put it so powerfully, 'The Word became flesh and dwelt amongst us, full of grace and truth.' St. John went on to declare that 'We have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father.' Dare we say that the 'success' of the first Christmas was God coming amongst us in Jesus Christ, and that the 'success' of every subsequent Christmas is to be measured in how deeply we perceive the grace and truth of the Christ-Child and behold his glory here and now.

However you will be spending Christmas, whether with family and friends or quietly, I hope that you will find some time to go, as the traditional introduction to Carol Services so poignantly puts it, 'in heart and mind even unto Bethlehem and see this thing which has come to pass and the Babe lying in a manger' and find again in him the truth of the good news that God sent his Son into the world that we might live through him.

#### Peter Hudson, 1934-2021

Peter was a dedicated and well-loved public servant and a true friend of the village. He moved to Henfield in 1971 and was active on Henfield Parish Council from 1979 to 2001, standing as Chairman from 1987-1992.

He was a proactive and hard-working Councillor, putting in place many improvements for the village and overseeing the formation of the Late-Night Shopping event. With the



Parish Council he took on responsibility for the Remembrance Parade, at the pivotal time when the Royal British Legion closed in the village, and much of the present and very successful format is from his original template. He oversaw the formation of the new Henfield Leisure Centre during his Chairmanship and helped to create the Coat of Arms, Henfield was only the second village in the country to have its own.

In later years, many Henfield people will remember his booming and friendly voice over the tannoy at countless village fairs. He exuded charm and kindness, his interview techniques encouraged even the shyest children to chat about their prizewinning 'vegetable monster' and it was always a pleasure to listen to his witty anecdotes. When the title of 'Citizen of Henfield' was bestowed upon him in 2002 it was well deserved, he was only the second person in Henfield to receive this accolade.

Peter was born in 1934 and grew up during WWII, he remembered watching the Battle of Britain in the skies above him, his 10th birthday fell on D-Day 1944. Upon leaving school he became a trainee Draftsman, then put his career on hold for three years' service in the RAF medical branch. He was married to Jackie in 1964 and they had four children; John, Susan, Lucie and Katie, they also have 10 grandchildren.

Peter was active in the Brighton Lions Club for 25 years, where he was president in 1974. Amongst other Lions projects and in response to the great elderly loneliness issues in Brighton, he helped set up the Brighton Lions Community Centre. Each day the centre welcomed over 100 elderly Brighton residents to enjoy activities such as keep fit, dancing, painting, sculpture, bingo and billiards. He went on to win the Winston Churchill Travelling Fellowship award for his studies of 'Loneliness amongst elderly people' in 1979 and met Her Majesty the Queen as part of the fellowship award. One of his favourite posts was as governor of a special needs school in Brighton, which he found incredibly fulfilling.

In Henfield he and Jackie were regular churchgoers at St Peter's, with Jackie teaching Sunday School for some time and Peter as Churchwarden for six years. He was also a Governor at St Peter's School for several years and longstanding trustee of the Dame Elizabeth Gresham Charity, which has served the village for 360 years!

In recognition of his service to the village, Peter was honoured by having Hudson Way on the Deer Park Estate named after him. In his final years he lived with Parkinson's and approached this challenge with all the good humour and resilience that is so reflective of his character.

Peter's funeral service was held at St Peters Church, Henfield on Wednesday 22nd September 2021


